# Clover "QUICK" YO-YO MAKER

## Large

Plate



Disk

Finished size: approx. 1 3/4" (45 mm)  
in diameter

## Small

Disk

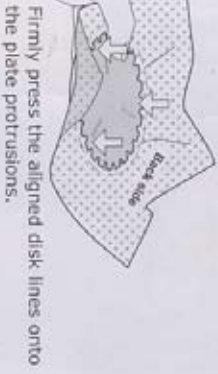


<Small>  
Finished size: approx. 1 1/8" (30 mm)  
in diameter

The side with protrusions, on which CLOVER can be read, is the front surface of the disk.

Front side

1. Securely insert the disk into the plate.



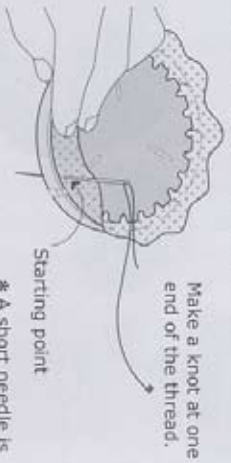
Firmly press the aligned disk lines onto the plate protrusions.

2. Cut the cloth, leaving a seam allowance of 1/8" to 1/4" (3 mm to 5 mm).



Leave 1/8" to 1/4" (3 mm to 5 mm) from the edge of the plate.

3. Fold the seam allowance and press it with your fingers. Insert the needle from the disk side.



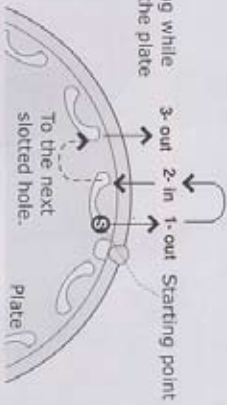
Make a knot at one end of the thread.

Starting point

\* A short needle is recommended.

4. Pull the needle out to the plate side (1-out). Next, insert the needle into the left side of the same slotted hole and pull it out to the disk side (2-in).

Keep sewing while looking at the plate side.



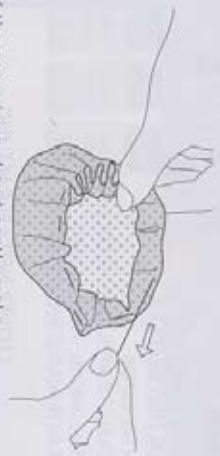
3-out 2-in 1-out Starting point

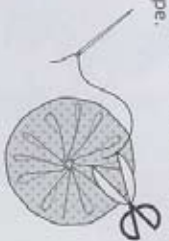
Starting point  
Repeating steps [4] and [5], continue sewing counterclockwise along the entire circumference while holding down the seam allowance with fingers at each stitch.

5. Close the seam by pulling the thread.

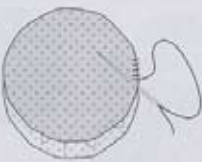


Fold the seam inward and neatly make creases.

6. When the opening is closed, make a knot. Cut the thread close to the cloth and form it into a round shape.



6. Whipstitch the patches right together.



6. Stitch the all required patches.
